Teachers shall receive \$25 per instructional hour. Instructional hours shall consist of time where teachers are working with students to further board approved programming. In addition to hourly rate teacher(s) shall receive, if any, 6% of any net programming income. Teaching Hours shall be turned into managing director on a weekly basis. Teachers shall schedule with management programming prior to date of instruction to reserve Fine Arts Center space. All compensation will be paid after completion of programming & receipt of all revenue, expenses & production documents. Educational programming must include a participation fee.

Chart 2: Compensation specifics:

Hourly Rate \$25 Instructors also receive 6% of any net profit.

Hypothetical Example: Children's chorus.

In their children's chorus proposal, Judy and Darby anticipated 30 participants and revenue from ticket sales at two performances based on an audience size of 70 and 150.

In actuality, 35 participated and performance audiences were 75 and 160.

This resulted in a net profit of \$300.

Registration: 5 additional @\$4=\$200 Performance seats: 5@\$4=\$20 10@\$8=\$80

Calculation: 6% of \$300= \$18. Judy and Darby get \$9 in addition to their hourly compensation.
